Students who are sponsored by a current member of ABGPA Midstream may be from any post-secondary school. Students who are also working in the Midstream industry may apply without necessarily being in a technical program.

Appalachian-region schools are defined as schools located within the following states:

Pennsylvania / Ohio / West Virginia / Maryland / New York

Applications will be reviewed by the Scholarship Committee, which will recommend qualified nominees to the Board of Directors.

The Scholarship Committee will evaluate applications based on merit of applicants who, through academic and extracurricular activities, demonstrate a desire to succeed and a commitment to making a positive contribution to others, and whose applications substantiate the minimum requirements noted below.

Applicants must meet the following qualifications:

1. Applicants must be enrolled in a trade school, undergraduate, or graduate program.
2. Applicants attending schools outside the Appalachian region are eligible only if sponsored by an active member of the ABGPA.
3. Applicants must have completed at least one internship or co-op for a company that services or owns and operates midstream oil and gas assets, unless enrolled in a technical/trade school program focused on skills necessary for the midstream oil and gas industry.
4. Applicants must possess a grade point average of 2.8 or greater on a 4.0 scale. Verification of GPA may be requested by the Scholarship Committee.
5. Applicant must be a U.S. Citizen.

Scholarship applications can be completed at abgpamidstream.org and letters of recommendation must be emailed to scholarship@abgpa.org. The ABGPA Midstream Scholarship Committee will review the applications and award in March/April. You will find the application on our website Scholarship page.
